MESSAGE FROM CHIEF KEPLEY

“About five police officers and VIPs canvassed the Valmonte neighborhoods the evening of May 31st inspecting cars parked on the street and in driveways looking for valuables left in plain sight. We graded each car and left a note indicating whether they passed or failed the inspection (every car received a note card so thieves would not target only cars with valuables inside aided by the visible cards on the windshield).

Approximately 325 cars were individually checked and unfortunately about 25% failed. I was also inspecting cars with the staff and I personally located five purses, a laptop computer, and several items of value inside cars, many of which were unlocked (you know who you are; we notified owners for those valuables). The point here is not to

embarrass anyone, but to educate and motivate people to be more diligent about removing items from their cars and lock them up. If we do not collectively improve this situation the word will get out (even more) that this is easy pickings here.

Please talk to your family members, friends, and neighbors and help us help you. These thefts from vehicles are nearly all preventable crimes that simply should not happen. Remember also, that what you may consider something of little value, such as sunglasses, will likely remain attractive to the thief. We have reported on sunglasses stolen, pocket change from the center console or ash tray, wallets, purses, etc.

The safest thing to do is to remove property from your car and keep it locked. Burglars always look under your seat, so don't rely on hiding your valuables. Stay safe.

NATIONAL HEIMLICH MANEUVER DAY

Each year on June 1, National Heimlich Maneuver Day is observed. Using abdominal thrusts to force air from the lungs to expel an object on which someone is choking is called the Heimlich Maneuver. Dr. Henry J. Heimlich created this life-saving procedure in 1974. The Heimlich Maneuver is also referred to as "Abdominal Thrusts". Certified instructors teach the Heimlich Procedure, and these courses are available across the country. According to the American Red Cross "choking causes over 3,000 deaths per year." Having the proper training and knowledge may help to save someone's life.
